

Social and Emotional Development Activity for 30 to 36 Months

Three Nice Mice

This is a wonderful rhyme to teach children in a group setting. Older siblings will enjoy teaching this fun interaction to their brothers and sisters.

Materials:

None

What to do:

- 1. Sing the following: "*Three nice mice. Three nice mice."* As you say each sentence, hold up three fingers on each hand as you say each sentence. Have the child mirror your actions and hold up three fingers also.
- 2. Form a circle with your hands and have the child do the same. Sing, "See how they care. See how they care." Bring the circles up to your eyes as if to look through binoculars at the mice.
- 3. Reach out and hands while singing, "They hold both hands and give a shake."
- 4. Move your clasped hands up and down in a handshake.
- 5. Continue holding hands and swinging them slightly from side to side as you keep rhythm with the rhyme, "*Smiling together, good friends they make.*"
- 6. Release your hands while each of you makes a complete turn as you sing, "*Then turning around*." When you are again face-to-face, give each other a gentle, loving high-five while singing, "*for goodness' sake."*
- 7. Return to holding up three fingers on each hand: "Three nice mice. Three nice mice."
