The key to being ready for kindergarten, having a better chance of doing well in school, and being more likely to succeed? **Parents reading with their children from birth!**

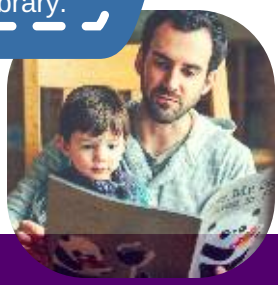


In 2014 the American Academy of Pediatrics issued a new policy that, for the first time, strongly recommended that parents should begin reading with their babies right away.

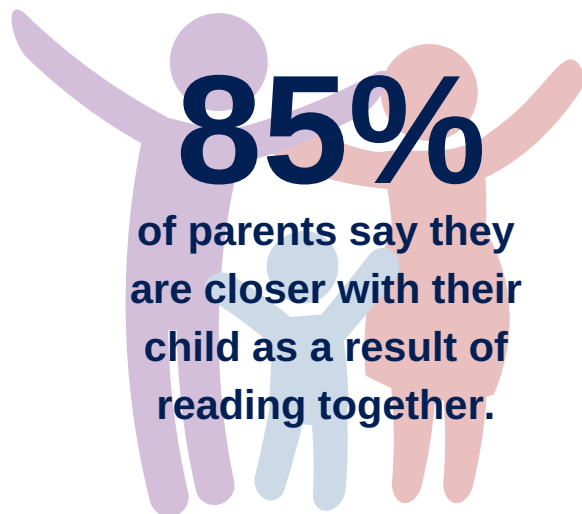
**The research is clear:** just the mere presence of books profoundly impacts a child's academic achievement. And reading expands a child's vocabulary. Children with larger vocabularies at age 2 entered kindergarten better prepared - in terms of both academics and behavior - than children with smaller vocabularies.

A survey of 2,530 Alaska parents with children enrolled in Imagination Library shows the program is working - increasing time spent reading, enhancing quality parent-child interactions, and developing a love of reading in thousands of Alaska children.

Shared reading time is quality time. Not only does reading build early literacy skills, **research tells us** it boosts healthy social and emotional development in children. When parents are engaged with their young children in meaningful ways, children are better prepared to form friendships, communicate emotions, and deal with challenges - all critical skills for success in school and beyond.

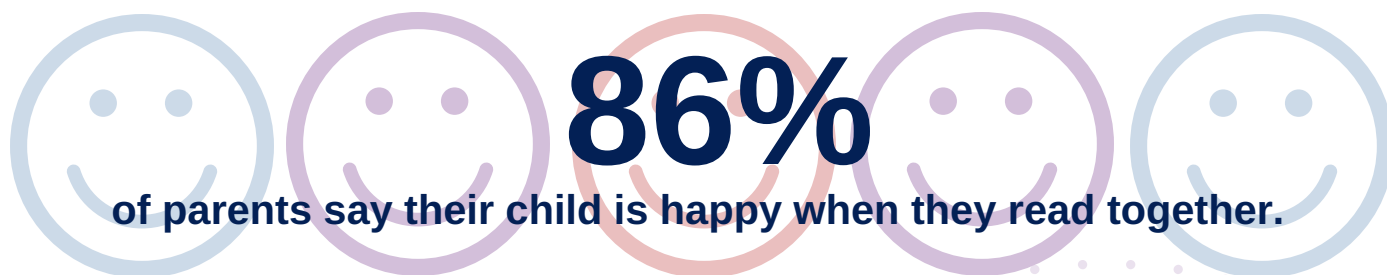

of parents say they can tell reading with their child makes her excited about reading.

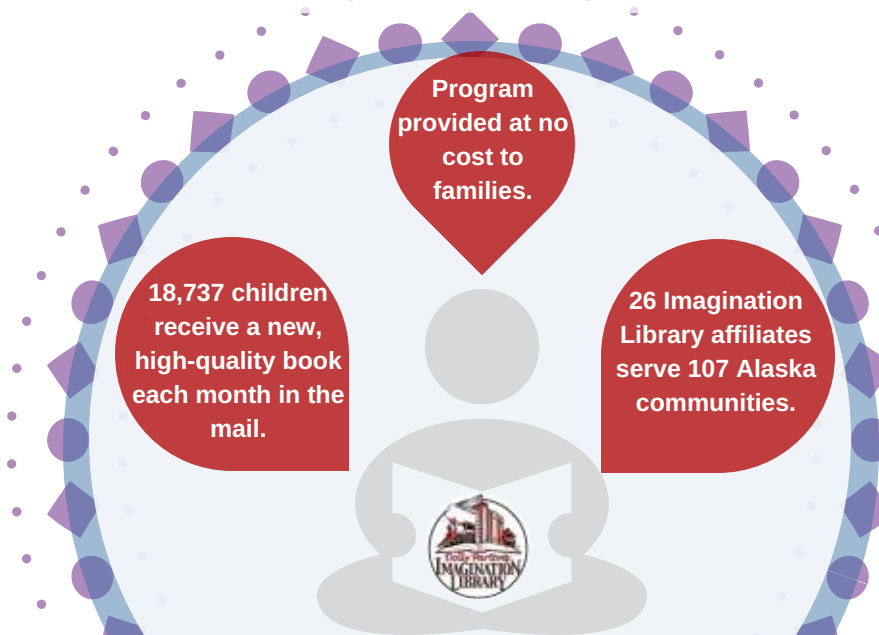
