SUMMARY OF BOOK: This book has lots of simple pictures and high contrast black and white pictures. It is a good first book for babies.

*BEFORE READING (Ask questions and use what the child already knows to add to the discussion, assisting the child in understanding and enjoying the book):

When you show your child the first page, place her hands on the page and point to her hands as well as the page and label "hands." You can also label other body parts, both on yourself and the child.

DURING READING:

1. As you read the book to your child, point to the pictures as you say the words. As you talk about the cat that stretches, also talk about how the cat is soft and furry, makes cat sounds like "meow," etc. For each object, describe to your child what it sounds, feels, smells, looks like.
2. As you read the book with your child, do the motions suggested in the book (hands reach, smile, stretch, etc.), and have your child do them also.

AFTER READING (activity to extend book experience):

Have physical objects of the ones in the book to show your child as you re-read the pages (plastic car, stuffed animal, plant, etc.), and let your child explore the objects.
